January 2025

Here we are at the start of a new year, taking down the Christmas decorations and packing them away until the next Advent season. The angel Gabriel, the journey to Bethlehem and the birth of Jesus have been celebrated and we now focus on events immediately after the birth of the Christ-child.

The shepherds tending their flocks under the night sky were visited by angels and told the good news of the birth of God's son. Is it significant that this first group of people to be told of the Saviour's birth were not the wealthy elite, but the poorest (and least respected) members of society, the shepherds?

The wise men from the East are journeying, guided by a star that shone brightly over Bethlehem, to pay homage to the new-born child. They brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh:

- Gold, a symbol of kingship, because Jesus as Pontius Pilate was to write on the inscription on the cross was King of the Jews.
- Frankincense, a symbol of deity, because Jesus as the disciples acknowledged was the Son of God.
- Myrrh, an anointing oil and symbol of death, because Jesus as history records was crucified on a hill outside Jerusalem.

The wise men had chosen their gifts carefully and made the long journey in the hope that they would get to see the promised Messiah, the Saviour of the world. Surely the wise men must have taken some time to plan their journey, to decide on gifts and purchase the gifts. They set out in faith, and in hope, that their journey would be worthwhile.

And so we continue our faith journey into another year......

Perhaps we too, like the wise men, need a plan, and perhaps we should consider what gifts we have that we can offer the King.

Having hopes and plans for the year ahead may stop us from merely 'doing what we have always done'. Perhaps we should ask, "God, is there something that you want me to do differently this year?"

Is there a job vacancy in our church family that you are well qualified to do? Is there a volunteering opportunity in your neighbourhood?

Or perhaps the answer is "For the moment, continue working, serving and caring in the way that you are, where the need is most obvious"

Whatever plans we have for the New Year, may God bless us in our service and may we be a beacon of hope to those around us.

THE 'MITE SCHEME' CHANGING TO 'SILVER SAVERS'

The church recently received a letter from the organiser of the Mite scheme to say that the scheme was closing at the end of this year. Paul Maiden, who administered the scheme in our church, is writing to the organiser to thank them for their many years of faithful collecting.

The mites, or 5p pieces, were collected at each Sunday service in the two tins, one tin representing salt and the other tin, sugar. The money collected was sent by Paul to the central organiser, who then sends the money to UNICEF where it is used to buy salt/sugar sachets that are used in the treatment of dehydration and malnutrition.

Paul has kindly volunteered to continue to collect donations, and will send the money directly to UNICEF.

With the decline in the use of cash in society, rather than just 5p pieces, we will be accepting any silver coinage (5p, 10p, 20p, 50p) and our scheme becomes 'Silver Savers' as the money raised literally saves lives.

Thanks for your continued support and thanks to Paul for administering this aspect of our giving.
