MARCH REFLECTION

I always think that March is a funny old month. It starts as if it is the depths of winter but by the end of the month we are firmly in spring with spring bulbs, longer days and a slight rise in temperature. Such is it with our Church month - we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday 5th March. Lent is a time of preparation, of letting go, of clearing room very similar to Advent in fact. We spend much of the time of Lent waiting, gradually moving along the journey from dark to light, from the darkness of the tomb to the sunrise on Easter morning and with it the glow of new life.

Easter, like Christmas, is a religious event in a secular setting. Whether it is bunnies and chicks or hot cross buns and crosses, it is a very public event in the life of the Church. It is the time of the year when churches can do something and throw open the doors of invitation. I'm going, it's going to be good, do you want to come with me? Perhaps a hot cross bun salvation giveaway – handing out buns and verses with an invitation to an event or even the Easter service.

Lent is perhaps a quieter time, a time for personal preparation. You may have Lent groups or a Lent book for the church. These activities of shared experience help to build a framework for our personal devotions. The fellowship of collective action, be it a Bible Study or knowing that others are reading the same book as you (can I recommend "Let Me Go There: Reflections for Lent" by Paula Gooder) can be inspirational and build you up on your own journey to the Cross.

As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God? - Psalm 42:1-2

This Lent, return to the Lord with your whole heart. Reflect on His grace and mercy. Seek His living and life-giving refreshment as you journey to the Cross.

The Retiring Collection in March is for MENCAP. This charity supports people with a learning disability. It also supports their families and carers.

TREASURED POSSESSIONS

As most of you will know, my dad passed away when I was just 10 years old. Dad was a pilot in the 2nd World War. He flew a mosquito and was what was called a hedge hopper – flying very low over enemy territory to drop incendiary bombs, which marked the targets for the big planes like the Lancaster bomber. He loved flying and he also loved driving a car.

At weekends Trish and I were allowed to help Dad clean his car and I distinctly remember how he polished his car with great pride and care, including the badges he displayed on the front of the vehicle, his favourite being his I.A.M.* badge. (The Institute of Advanced Motorists) The Institute was formed in 1956, so Dad was a <u>very</u> early member. All members have to have passed the advanced driving test in a car.

On leaving school, I went to a teacher training college in Leeds, but then came back to Wigan to start my teaching career. My first jobs were local, so I could walk there. Later on, after I had my two daughters, I got a part time job in Hindley Green. I was very lucky to have a lift there from a colleague, but had to catch a bus home. Not only did most of the buses go all round the housing estates, but their destination was Wigan town centre bus station, so I had to drag my wheelie case (very heavy with books for marking) back home on a twenty minute walk.

Around this time, my younger sister, Ros, passed her driving test and could not resist saying to me, "Ner, ner, ner, ner ner! There's only you that can't drive now Jen!"

That did it. I booked myself in for driving lessons and was pleased to pass a few months later. When I received my driving certificate, there were also some information leaflets and adverts connected with driving. One of the leaflets was an invitation to train in increased driving skills, including on the motorway. This was with the I.A.M. Memories of dad came flooding back – how proud he was to have his badge on the car. I just felt compelled to go for it. The lessons were led by trained volunteers and they met the trainees down at Asda car park at a given time at weekends.

Six weeks later I took the test and was pleased to pass first time. I went round to Mum's to let her know my good news. She congratulated me and said how very pleased she was. To my joy and amazement, she took something from a kitchen drawer and quietly said she would like me to have it. Yes you have guessed – it was dad's precious I.A.M. badge.
